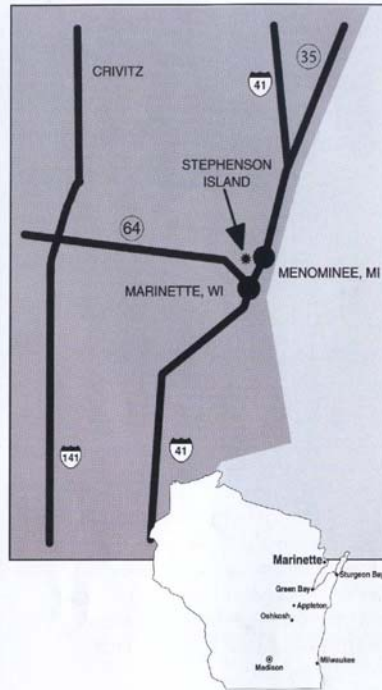



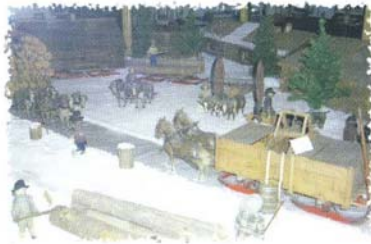
Featuring . . .

The Logging Era-



See a logging camp in miniature, outfitted from the late 1800s and early 1900s, "when white pine was king". The camp features buildings, tools, horse-drawn equipment, bunkhouse, blacksmith shop and workers.

Marinette . . . Her Story



The city's name honors Marinette, a 19th century trading post owner. Local tradition sometimes refers to her as "Queen Marinette," evidently acknowledging her abilities in trade, politics, and cultural relations.

In the Museum Yard-

See the ice road rutter rig that cuts ruts in the iced roads the same width as logging sleigh runners to keep the sleigh on the tracks. A "chic-a-dee" walked behind the rig to clean up the horse droppings . . . left to freeze where it dropped, the manure could tip a load of logs! The rig also could be used as a snowplow.

Evancheck Family Cabin-



Preserved, restored and furnished, the Evancheck log cabin is a nostalgic, one of a kind, example of farmsteading in Marinette County 100 years ago.
